MEDICAL EMERGENCIES IN DENTISTRY

Synopsis:

The objective of this course is to cover the basic principles for the prevention and management of medical emergencies in the dental office. Prevention is discussed by reviewing important drug interactions and the management of the medically compromised patient. A review of emergency equipment and the pharmacology of resuscitative drugs will follow. Treatment protocols for specific emergencies, such as allergic reactions, cardiovascular emergencies, and local anesthetic toxicity, among others, will be presented. Recommendations will be provided for the preparation of an emergency kit and the roles of staff members. This course will be of interest to all members of the dental team.

Learning objectives:

1. Learn how to prevent medical emergencies by avoiding potential drug interactions and modifying patient management based on the medical history.
2. Learn the basic principles which form the basis for all medical emergencies that may occur in dental offices.
3. Understand the pharmacology of the drugs used for medical emergencies.
4. Know how to set up your own emergency kit.
5. Know the step-by-step approach for the management of specific medical emergencies that can take place in our offices.
6. Know how each team member contributes to emergency management.
