Faculty Associates Program



The majority of the Center for Faculty Excellence's (CFE's) faculty development programming each year is created and facilitated by Faculty Associates and Fellows. Faculty and professional staff who teach apply annually to be an Associate or Fellow, and positions are awarded on a selective basis. Associates and Fellows design and deliver programs aimed to enhance student learning, promote the scholarship of teaching and learning, and facilitate an institution-wide understanding of effective teaching and learning, research and scholarship, and leadership.

Faculty Associate: faculty or staff selected for a 2-year term; Senior Faculty Associate: faculty or staff selected for a subsequent 2-year term; Faculty Fellow: faculty or staff selected for a 1-year term to assist with a specific CFE project need.

Faculty Associates and Fellows become part of the Creighton community of scholars interested in building and engaging a culture of assessment and learner-centered teaching. Associates, Senior Associates, and Fellows will be supported in their roles and programming efforts. Each Associate/Senior Associate will be awarded \$2,000 for their professional development use in each year of their two-year associates term. Fellows are also awarding professional development funds commensurate with their project focus.
